### Mission Statement

A challenging, cohesive and inclusive K-12 curriculum that creates a learning environment in which students know that they have ownership of their academic future and are fully supported in that ownership by the staff.

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### Superintendent's Highlights

For the sixteenth consecutive year, since the adoption of No Child Left Behind, all Storey County schools met adequate yearly progress. We are one of only two school districts in Nevada to achieve this level of success. Annually, a group of high school students travel to Huntsville, Alabama to compete in The Great Moonbuggy Race. With international competition, both at the college and high school level, our team was among the top finishers, including a first place finish. This year the school district achieved the highest graduation rate in the state, 100%! Another highlight this year was the third year of the Jump Start program at Western Nevada College. Half of our Juniors and Seniors enrolled in formal college classes at WNC. Our success was fantastic. Over ninety percent of the students passed the classes with nearly two-thirds receiving A's and B's. In athletics we excelled. We won the Northern Nevada Championship in football and baseball. Our boys basketball and girls volleyball team were #1 seeds in regionals as well.

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### Goals and Objectives

Goal 1: Meet yearly AYP targets in all schools

Status: All schools continue to achieve AYP targets.

Future: However, the state is changing how AYP targets are determined, rewarding growth more than achievement of a standard.

Goal 2: Balanced budget with a secure reserve

Status: District continues to maintain a 4% reserve.

Future: Changing demographics of Nevada (growth of Southern Nevada) may alter our financial status after the next legislative session.

Goal 3: All regular teachers meet NCLB standards (highly qualified)

Status: All teachers continue to meet NCLB standards, except for teachers new to the profession who are completing their credential requirements. This is no longer a federal government requirement. High School math also implemented a 1:1 notebook instructional program.

Goal 4: Comprehensive Technology Committee

Status: Implementation of 4-5 laptop initiative/1:1 computers & web-based K-8 level.

Future: As technology changes, classroom environments will change.

### District Communication Efforts

The Storey County School District is committed to fostering on-going parent communications and uses a variety of techniques to engage parents. The district recognizes that we are partners with parents in the education of their children. There are twice a year parent conference days along with weekly school newsletters at the elementary sites. The community is also invited to monthly school board meetings to offer input on issues that are important to our stakeholders. Additionally, the district maintains a website with updated academic and extracurricular information, along with contact information for all board members and district personnel. All schools also use Infinite Campus, a web-based grading program that allows instant access 24/7 to parents and students to monitor their academic progress. Parents can also email staff directly from Infinite Campus. Each school hosts a yearly open house with the high school hosting two a year. All sites also sponsor family activities both during the day and in the evening that allow parents and school personnel to develop a positive relationship. This school culture building is essential to creating an environment where student success is expected and celebrated. Finally, the Superintendent of Schools maintains an open door policy for all district stakeholders. The community is encouraged to bring questions, concerns or accolades directly to the Superintendent.

## Discipline

Storey County School District takes bullying very seriously. Virginia City High School principal wrote about his commitment to end and prevent bullying in the Welcome Back to School letter; invested in high quality posters with anti-bullying themes; had an assembly on the first day back to school and on the first day of the second semester which addresses bullying and during the governor's week of respect had students in small groups view a video on the topic of bullying followed by a lesson on bullying. At the K-8 level a letter was developed to handle reports of bullying within the three schools. If a student reported bullying, the letter was sent to all involved, phone calls were made to the parents regarding the letter and to let parents know that we were investigating the incident. After the investigation was complete, a phone call was made to the parties involved stating the outcome and punishment. During the governor's week of respect each teacher in the elementary level was given a variety of options to address bullying in their classroom. Most teachers used a web-site called [pacerkidsagainstbullying.org](http://pacerkidsagainstbullying.org). The web-site was used each day during the Week of Respect. On the last day, classrooms created posters and placed them on the walls around the school. At the middle school level they held an assembly and showed the movie "Bully". After the movie they had a school-wide discussion followed by small group discussions in each classroom and asked students to come up with plans or ideas on how to combat bullying. Posters and flyers were placed around the school.
